This annual report covers the Foundation's 2011 fiscal year (January 1, 2012 - December 31, 2012)

Noolaham Foundation is a non-profit, charitable organization (GA 2390) founded to provide enhanced access to information sources and foster knowledge-based development in Sri Lanka.

The Foundation maintains an online digital library, facilitates information preservation programs, provides financial assistance and technical guidance for digitization initiatives, and actively participates in awareness-raising campaigns. It also coordinates a range of fund raising activities and collaborates with other organizations and individuals.

The free internet library (<u>www.noolaham.org</u>) maintained by the Foundation serves as a learning center incorporating local knowledge and enabling social interaction with a view to achieving constructive social outcomes. This digital library functions as a repository for various institutions, supports the cognitive work of scholars and researchers, and fulfills the information needs of social workers, teachers, historians, and the general public.

Volunteers of Noolaham Foundation engage with Noolaham's activities globally and establish Noolaham chapters in their respective countries to achieve the mission of the Foundation.

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Mission

Document and preserve all spheres of knowledge related to Sri Lankan Tamil speaking communities and make it accessible to all.

Objectives

- Document, preserve and digitally archive ethnography and knowledge bases such as dialects, belief systems, myths, rituals, folklore, games, indigenous medicine, law and administrative systems, technologies and arts of mainstream and marginalized communities.
- Engage in and support preservation and digital archiving of written, print, multimedia and electronic resources related to Sri Lankan Tamil speaking communities.
- Provide knowledge and information services to ensure free and open access, and thereby support educational, research and development endeavors related to Sri Lankan Tamil speaking communities.
- Build communities of practice, processes, technologies and standards of archival, library information sciences through communication, networking and collaboration.

Guiding Principles

- Unity: Entities of Noolaham Foundation shall exist in different geographical, legal and political territories. Noolaham Foundation always ensures unity in its strategic framework, its design, program, budget and communications.
- Openness: As the driving force of Noolaham Foundation is centered on open data, open access and open knowledge, it does not charge the end-users for accessing its archive. It expects end-users not to use the contents for individual or corporate economic gain.
- Transparency: All of Noolaham's operations strive to be open and transparent. Our commitment includes detail accounting reports, comprehensive governance, programs, and information dissemination and responsiveness to request for information.
- Unbiased: Noolaham Foundation is an unbiased entity. While it engages volunteers from different political thoughts, parities and stands for Noolaham's mission, it does not allow volunteers to use Noolaham Foundation for their political engagement and leverage. Noolaham Foundation shall take appropriate measures to ensure from being politicized or being labeled.
- Volunteerism: Volunteerism is the basis for all of Noolaham's operations. The Annual work plan will be formulated giving emphasis on volunteer contribution, to optimize the overheads and performance targets for each team.
- Collaboration: Noolaham strives to avoid duplication and repetition of work, and thereby promotes synergy among similar organizations in digital documentation and preservation. Noolaham Foundation shall support institutions to complete projects, if such collaboration optimizes the productivity and vice versa.
- Participation: Broadening and strengthening the participation of the stakeholders of Noolaham Foundation is part and parcel of Noolaham's culture. It consults with all the stakeholders to make or review the policies and decisions that affect the business of Noolaham Foundation. Noolaham shall introduce mechanisms to ensure active participation of the stakeholders, to maintain team spirit, to value innovations and to appreciate excellence.

2012 IN REVIEW

During 2012, Noolaham Foundation was further strengthened to carry out various documentation activities. We obtained project grants for two archiving projects. Pilot projects to digitize manuscripts were conducted. We obtained expertise and equipment to digitize rare materials as well.

Other highlights of 2012 include:

Noolaham Digital Library

As they are available to anybody in any part of the world at any given time, digital libraries make possible enhanced access to information. The free Internet library (www.noolaham.org) maintained by the Noolaham Foundation serves as a learning center incorporating local knowledge and enables social interaction with a view to achieving constructive social outcomes. It functions as a repository for various institutions, and fulfills the information needs of students, researchers, historians, activists and the public.

2,050 documents were added during 2012 to the Project Noolaham database, taking the tally from 10,058 to 12,108. They include

These documents were published in 108 years. The books include publications of 1,586 publishers and 2,147 authors. There were four Special Archives and nine portals enhancing the accessibility of the website. During 2012, the Muslim Archive Pilot Project was carried out as well.

Pallikoodam

Pallikoodam (Tamil word for School), another ambitious initiative of Noolaham Foundation has been started during 2012. The vision of this initiative is to create open, freely accessible, self-organizing virtual learning environments for the Sri Lankan Tamil speaking students and educators.

The first project (Digital Library for School Students Pilot Project) was started in October 2012 and it will be finished in 2013. Two project officers were assigned for scanning and all other activities are being carried out by volunteers, mainly university students. These volunteers have approached schools, private institutions, individuals and education departments to identify, locate and collect educational resources. About 500 exam papers have already been digitized. So far many schools from Jaffna, Trincomalee and Colombo have provided or agreed to provide their study materials for this project.

The Department of Education, Northern Province has given us permission to collect resources from all the schools that come under their purview. Some Zonal Education Departments have agreed to provide resources as well. Resource collecting activities are currently being extended to other districts as well.

Manuscripts Archive

During 2012, we carried out three projects to digitize manuscripts including Ola leave works. The flatbed scanners we had were not suitable to digitize such fragile documents. So we approached the French Institute of Pondicherry for technical guidance. EAP 458 Team (Endangered Archive Project is an initiative of British Library) has provided us with training and a blueprint of their mobile scanning equipment. We have built one such equipment and have begun to use it as well. This equipment was introduced in the first seminar as well.

Content Contributors

By June 2010, we had stopped uploading digitized versions of recent publications. We continued providing limited access to new releases during 2011 and 2012 as well. Even though this is against our principle of open access, we support publication initiatives and are streamlining the release of digital copies without hindering the publishing industry.

From 2011 we began to focus our resources towards obtaining written permissions from writers and publishers. By December 2012, about 280 writers gave their consent to include their entire works at Noolaham Digital Library. During 2012, our permissions database was revamped and numerous publications archived and listed but not made available online because of copyright restrictions at the time of digitization are made accessible now.

We continued to promote Creative Commons licensing and encouraged writers and publishers to release their work under licenses which enable free flow of knowledge. A booklet about Creative Commons was distributed at Noolaham events.

Infrastructure

We have obtained an office space at Colombo Tamil Sangam to streamline our activities. This office space has enabled efficient coordination of various projects. Ah-Kol Institute has provided an office space in Kokuvil, Jaffna and Jaffna Pubic Library also have given a space to us to conduct digitization.

Collaboration

The Foundation collaborates with various initiatives and organizations in knowledge-related activities. Details of some of the collaborating organizations are compiled elsewhere in this report. We hope more institutions, publishers and authors will collaborate with us to build vast collections of open access information sources so that everyone has equal access to information.

Events and meetings

A special event commemorating the digitization of 10,000 publications and seven years of Noolaham Foundation's activities was conducted on 25th February 2012 at Colombo. Hon. Mr. Vasudeva Nanayakkara, (Minister, Ministry Of National Language & Social Integration) participated as the chief guest at this event.

An introductory event was organized in Toronto, Canada on 7th April 2012 to introduce Noolaham's activities to the public. Prof. R. Cheran, Mr. Nahulasihamany, Mr. Kiruthihan , Prof. S. R. Selvakumar and Mr. L. Natkeeran spoke at the event.

A seminar about digital documentation was conducted on 9th September, 2012 in Jaffna. A wide range of people from different spheres of society were invited to the event. Mr. K. Guruparan (Lecturer, Faculty of Law, University of Jaffna), Dr. J. Arangaraj, S. Seran and S.

Sureshkumar addressed the seminar and digitization techniques were introduced. A short film was screened as well.

An event to introduce Noolaham activities and Puthiya Noolaham newsletter was conducted at Vadamaradchi, Jaffna during May. At World Tamil Literary Conference 2012, a presentation about Ithazhaham was made. We also organized a booth at the Conference to introduce Noolaham's activities.

Strategic Plan 2012-2014

Headed by Ramanaish Kathiravelu and with the contribution from various individuals, a three year strategic plan for the Foundation and a Roadmap were created in 2011. The strategic planning process has prioritized six strategies for Noolaham Foundation over the three years. The strategies were formulated to make use of the strengths and opportunities of the Foundation to address the issues and challenges identified during the process to achieve the agreed targets by 2014.

Human Resources

By December 2012, Seran Sivananthamoorthy has resigned from being the chief operating Officer Noolaham Foundation. Seran had joined the Foundation to undertake administrative tasks and in November 2010, he was formally appointed as the Chief Operating Officer of the Foundation. He continues his services as Director (Projects) This year numerous others have joined our task forces. Details are included elsewhere in this report.

Publications

Puthiya Noolaham newsletter was published once in every two months. This newsletter carries news about the activities conducted by Noolaham Foundation. A booklet about Creative Commons was published during June 2012 and was distributed to writers. A booklet about Ithazhaham initiative was also released during 2012.

During 2012, we have begun to collaborate with Ezhuna Media Foundation to republish rare out of copyright books. Two such books were identified during 2012 and they will be published by Ezhuna Media Foundation during 2013.

Archival partners

While working with various institutions the need to deposit our collections with other institutions was realized. Colombo Tamil Sangam, a Colombo based cultural organization was presented with the archived publications during June, 2012. Jaffna Public Library was presented with copies of the digitized publications during the 1st documentation seminar in September 2012.

Library Science Advisory Board

Over the years various librarians have supported Noolaham's activities. During 2012 we created a Library Science Advisory Board consisting such librarians. This Board includes Mr. S. Thanabalasingam (Retired Librarian, Jaffna Public Library), Mrs. Imelda Karunakaran (Librarian, Jaffna Public Library) and Mrs. Kalpana Chandasekar (Librarian, Medical facultry, University of Jaffna) among others.

Finances

During 2012, a total of 26 donors together contributed LKR 2,336,406.50. Details of these donations are included elsewhere in this report. This contribution includes project grant provided by Neelan Tiruchelvam Trust and US Embassy.

On the 1st of May 2012, Amarasekara and Co were appointed as the Auditors of Noolaham Foundation and they audited the Financial Reports of 2011. Even though we have been publishing our financial reports since 2008, this is the first time they are audited by professional auditors. This external audit has found that certain control mechanisms are lacking and corrective actions have been undertaken.

Active community involvement is vital to a 21st century knowledge instituition. We are fortunate in that several organizations and individuals have joined hands with us. At this juncture, we would like to express our heartfelt thanks to all of them.

Volunteers have been contributing in various ways; donors have provided increased financial support to the Foundation; the Thamizha organization continues to host our site on their server; technical support personnel, advisors, patrons, and well-wishers continue to contribute generously; and above all, our content providers - the authors and publishers - help to further our collections.



INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To The Members of Noolaham Foundation (Company Limited by Guarantee)

Report on the Financial Statements

1. We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Noolaham Foundation (Company Limited by Guarantee) which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2012, and the statement of comprehensive income and cash flow statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes as set out on Pages 02 - 09.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

2. Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards for Small and Medium-sized Entities' (SLFRS for SMEs). This responsibility includes: designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Scope of Audit and Basis of Opinion

3. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Sri Lanka Auditing Standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

4. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.

5. We have obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit. We therefore believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

Opinion

6. In our opinion, so far as appears from our examination, the financial statements appear to show a fair picture of the Company's financial position as at 31 December 2012 and its results and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with Sri Lanka Accounting Standards for Small and Medium-sized Entities' (SLFRS for SMEs).

1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Noolaham Foundation is a Limited Liability Company by Guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Sri Lanka under Companies Act No. 07 of 2007. The Registered Office of the Company is located at No. 07, 57th Lane, Colombo 06.

1.1 Principal Activities and Nature of Operations

The Objectives for which the Foundation established are,

- To engage in activities relating to digital library services.
- To support digital preservation projects by providing financial assistance
- To provide advices on digital and archiving technology and preservation
- To create virtual digital libraries by indexing other websites.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with the Sri Lanka Accounting Standards for Small and Medium-sized Entities' (SLFRSs for SMEs).

2.1.1 Transition to the SLFRS for SMEs

Basis of Transition

The financial statements of The Noolaham Foundation (Company Limited by Guarantee) for the year ended 31 December 2012 are the first Annual financial statements prepared to comply with SLFRS for SMEs.

The date or Transition is 1 January 2011, the Opening Balance of the financial statements are Adjusted to comply with the New Standards. In preparing these financial statements the company has applied all mandatory exceptions.

2.1.2 Reporting Period

The financial statements are prepared and presented at end of the financial year 31 December 2012, for local requirements.

2.1.3 Property, Plant and Equipment

Cost

Property, Plant and Equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and less any impairment losses.

The cost of plant and equipment is the cost of acquisition or construction together with any expenses incurred in bringing assets to its working condition for its intended use. Subsequent expenditure incurred for the purpose of acquiring, extending or improving assets of a permanent nature by means of which to carry on the business or to increase the earning capacity of the business is treated as capital expenditure.

Gains and losses on disposal of an item of property, plant and equipment are determined by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount of property, plant and equipment, and are recognized net within "other income" in profit or loss.

Depreciation

Depreciation is recognized in profit or loss on a straight line method over the estimated useful lives of each part of an item of property, plant and equipment. Depreciation is provided on property, plant & equipment, from the following month of purchase to the month of disposal.

The estimated depreciation rate and useful lives are as follows;

Assets Category	Depreciation Rate	Useful Lives
Office Equipment	12.5%	8 Years
Furniture and Fittings	20.0%	5 Years
Computer	50.0%	2 Years

Depreciation of items of property, plant and equipment will be charged when those items are available for use and continue depreciating until it is derecognized.

Gain and losses on disposal of plant and equipment are determined by reference to their carrying amount and are taken into account in determining the operating profit.

2.1.4 Cash and cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise current Accounts, cash in hand and deposits held at call with banks. Bank overdrafts are included in the statement of financial position. For purpose of cash flow statement cash and cash equivalents are presented net of bank overdrafts.

2.2 LIABILITIES AND PROVISIONS

2.2.1 General

All known liabilities have been provided for in preparing the Financial Statements contingent events and their financial impact if any, are disclosed in notes to the Financial Statements.

2.2.2 Funds

The funds that are restricted are recognized at their fair value. When such funds relate to an expense item it is recognized as income over the period necessary to match it, so the costs which it is intended to compensate for on a systematic basis. Funds that are related to assets are deferred in the Balance Sheet and credited to the Income Expenditure account at the end of the project.

2.3 RECEIPTS / EXPENSES RECOGNITION

2.3.1 Receipts

Receipts are recognized on systematic and rational basis over the period necessary to match them with the related cost.

2.3.2 Expenditure

All Expenses are recognized as and when such expenses are incurred.
